Position of the course

Acquisition of thorough understanding and fluent mastery of the structure and the lexicon of Modern Greek. Students are able to write themselves scientific texts in Modern Greek, and to submit existing texts to linguistic analysis.

Contents

Building on the knowledge acquired during the bachelor phase, contemporary Greek literary and non-literary texts are read, fully analyzed and commented orally and in writing. Tutored redaction of reading report.

Initial competences

A good basic knowledge of Modern Greek, acquired during the bachelor training.

Final competences

- 1 Full knowledge and fluent mastery of syntax, full knowledge and fluent mastery of morphology and full knowledge and fluent mastery of the lexicon of modern Greek.
- 2 To be able to analyse and understand written literary and non-literary texts.
- 3 To be able to redact a written report in a scientific register.
- 4 To be able to follow an oral exposé and to comment orally a given text in Greek.

Calculation of the examination mark
