### Position of the course

This advanced course wants to provide the student with a thorough scientific insight into the specific characteristics of Dutch literary texts and the historical functions of literature. The course teaches students how to conduct a research on literary theory independently.

### Contents

In this course, specific research themes are discussed in preparation of the individual research assignment. In the first meetings the teachers introduce a research theme and research methods. In the following meetings, students report on their progress and are given advice and feedback in the process.

## Initial competences

To have completed the courses Dutch Literature I-IV or to have acquired the necessary skills by other means.

## Final competences

- 1 To be able to apply models while analysing texts and situating them in a historical and literary context
- 2 To be able to report on autonomously conducted research on literary research.
- 3 To be able to apply the methods of analysis of literary theory.
