Students acquire, on the basis of an intensive programme, an elementary knowledge of grammar and basic vocabulary of Modern Greek, which is immediately put into practice.

#### Initial competences

To have successfully completed the course Modern Greek: language acquisition I or to have acquired the necessary skills by other means.

#### Final competences

- 1 To have knowledge of the basic morphology of Modern Greek.
- 2 To have an active knowledge of the basic vocabulary
- 3 To be able to understand simple texts.
- 4 To be able to understand everyday conversation.
- 5 To be able to express oneself in an everyday situation in Modern Greek.
