Position of the course

This advanced course wants to initiate students of Greek and/or Latin in independent linguistic or literary research and scientific reporting.

Contents

This advanced course gives thorough insight in the practical application of different methods for linguistic or literary research. It teaches the students to execute autonomous research by using one or more scientific methods and by reporting on this research in the form of a presentation. The course intends to be a methodological accompaniment to the bachelor paper. Next to a number of general, plenary lessons the students will meet to report on their ongoing research. During those meetings feedback will guide them through the process.

Initial competences

A thorough command of classical Latin and/or Greek. Having the necessary competence in Latin and/or Greek literature and linguistics.

Final competences

- 1 to formulate a relevant research question
 - 2 to develop a research strategy in function of a research question
 - 3 to report (in oral and written communication) on research in a scientifically correct way
 - 4 to evaluate different paradigmatic and methodological options
 - 5 to use the relevant theoretical concepts and methods
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- 6 to critically evaluate one's own research question, methodological choices and results
