Position of the course

In order to enable a thorough study of the Italian language, a sound command of, and insight into, basic grammar is required. This basic grammar is included in the study unit "Italian: Grammar A" (1ISA), and further developed in "Italian: Grammar B" and applied (with the help of exercises) in Italian: Language Practice A and Italian: Language Practice B. This study unit constitutes the first step towards acquiring a sound grasp of Italian. The student acquires basic rules for building and using different parts of speech and tenses, enabling him/her to understand simple Italian texts and to form simple Italian sentences.

Contents

The study unit "Italian: Grammar A" (1ISA) covers a range of learning contents as regards the basic components of the Italian language. In particular the following subjects are dealt with:

- morphology: basic rules for the forming of nouns, adjectives, verbs, articles, prepositions, adverbs and pronouns;
- syntax: general rules on the use of different tenses and modes, and rules on forming main clauses.

Initial competences
