Position of the course

The study unit "Italian: grammar B" (I1SB) extends already acquired basic knowledge of the Italian language, so as to enable students to understand more complex Italian texts and to express themselves with the help of an extended range of grammatical structures. Upon completion of this study unit, students are able to recognize, analyze and use correctly the basic structures of the Italian language.

Contents

The study unit "Italian: Grammar B" (I1SB) covers a range of learning contents developing the basic insights acquired in the study unit "Grammar A". The following items are dealt with:

- morphology: development of the study of the rules relating to the formation of verbs and pronouns;
- syntax: development of the study of the rules for the use of several tenses and modes as well as the rules on forming simple and compound sentences.
