Extra information on the examination methods

Format: Conversations with the promotor or co-promotor in which the evolution of the research is clarified
Report Frequency : the conversations take place by appointment. The frequency depends on the progress of the project
In case of unfounded absence the examination committee will decide on an extra assignment
Modified second chance examination: the examination committee will decide on an extra assignment. Result will be communicated to the student together with results of other courses. Feedback is possible on appointment.

Calculation of the examination mark

60% evaluation of the progress/realization of the research project through conversations with promotor/co-promotor
40% evaluation of the final report
