Position of the course

In this part of the course, students gain an in-depth insight into the thinking behind legislation and regulations, starting from the concepts that they are based on. The students gain insight into the structure of the different authorities, as well as into the validity of legislation and standards. Students will learn to find the up-to-date legislation. This part of course fits in with the key competences: - being able to work within the existing legal framework - and aimed at the application of the most recent legislation.

Contents

- Legal framework:
  - Introduction (Definition, sources of law,...)
  - Authorities (Competences, functions, type of authority (local, national, supranational, international),...)
  - Contents of legislation (General, building regulations (B, NL, D, UK, F) occupational safety and health,...)
  - Enforcement (Liability, control (courts, fire brigade),...)
- Technical specifications:
  - Building regulations (Construction products directive and "Koninklijk besluit van 7 juli 1994", Approved document B - Volume 2, "Bouwbesluit 2012")
  - Occupational safety and health legislation (ARAB art. 52)
