Position of the course

Case studies and practicals in relationship and family therapy in the Master (specialization Clinical psychology) provides a further deepening in specific cases within the field of relationship and family therapy. The focus here is on ONE person (and no longer on people in general).

Contents

In this course the following topics are discussed:

- translation of hypotheses and goals into techniques;
- indications and contra-indications for the use of several techniques;
- the specific modifications of these techniques required for several pathologies, units (couples, families, individuals) and settings.
