It will provide insight into the historical interrelatedness of all modern Slavonic languages and their relation to Old Slavonic and also provide insight into the prehistory of Slavic.

Part 1: Lectures on the historical phonetics of Slavic. Part 2: Historical-linguistic analysis of an Old Slavonic text.
