Position of the course

The course 'Internship Extra covers an extra training period of minimum 20 working days, domain-related to the educational program of the student, in the same Workplace as internship 1 or 2:

The student will be engaged in every-day working activities at a level corresponding to their final degree. Upon completion of the internship, the student will write a more extended report and the extended report (see guidelines on the info site of the MSc. Nutrition and rural development on Minerva) will be defended for a jury the report will cover the period of the first and the extended internship. In the extended report students will pay attention not only to the practical work they performed but also to managerial, economic and strategic aspects. The report will contain a critical reflection on the how well the programme learning objectives have prepared the student for the internship.

**Internship should take place in the same organisation as chosen for internship 1**

The extra internship activities should also be related to the knowledge and know-how acquired through the specific study program for which the student is registered and should give an extra added value for future (search) possibilities for a (more relevant) job

Initial competences
